### Summer Term Clubs

This term we are pleased to be able to introduce a new club to our timetable; Mrs Goacher will be running a Stoolball club.

**Stoolball** is a sport that dates back to at least the 15th century, originating in [Sussex](#). It may be an ancestor of [cricket](#) sometimes called "Cricket in the air". Traditionally it was played by [milkmaids](#) who used their milking [stools](#) as a "[wicket](#)".

Stoolball is played on grass with 2 teams, one team fielding and the other batting. Each over consists of 8 balls. The "wicket" itself is a square piece of wood at head or shoulder height fastened to a post. Traditionally the seat of a stool hung from a post or tree was used. Some versions used a tall stool placed upright on the ground.

We also have a new 'Debating' club which Mrs Pinnington will be running where children will be able to discuss current topics of their choice. They will be able to build on their ability to present a reasoned argument and improve their research and presentation skills in a fun and exciting way.

Alex Urquhart will be introducing a Violin/Viola club for the children already learning these instruments in school. We have also invited children from Singleton to join us on a Friday for our 'String' club.

The timetable is attached with all the information for our clubs for Summer term 1, 5 weeks up to half term.

Booking will be open on School Money on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> April and will be on a first come first served basis. Spaces are limited to do make sure you book your places early if there is a particular club that your child is interested in.
