MATHS

Mrs. Johnson and I have been working hard behind the scenes to introduce several new maths initiatives which will help you to support your children easily at home, to see clearly what your child's targets/areas to work on are, and to give us some really tangible achievements to celebrate. You will all have had your **Sumdog** login details - lots of children are already whizzing along with this and making super progress. If you need support in this, please come and speak to Mrs. Johnson.

At the end of this newsletter, there is a selection of questions for children to have a go at. Each week we will publish some questions for children to try. They will be able to bring their solutions to school by the following Wednesday to earn house points! The questions will also give you, as parents and carers, a further benchmark for the sort of maths we expect each year group to be able to do, independently. The most neat and accurate solutions will be published the following week. Please see below for details.

In addition to this, we have a new system for pupils' **maths targets**, which will build a progression in number skills into our work in school. This is called our **Maths Matters Challenges**. Some of you will already have seen the work the children have been doing. Next week we will be publishing the progression and each child will have a target to work on. Children will very much be able to progress at their own speed: the more support you can give them at home, the better.

Rambling Club

This week we had our very first 'Rambling Club'. Mrs Goacher and I took some of our children through the village and up towards the Trundle. We walked through the woods and along the side of the field with a crop of oats and back along the wall. We misjudged the timing a little as there was so much to stop and look at along the way. The children were trying to guess the different fields of crops that they could see and we discussed what we could see and hear, looked at the wind blowing the crops and the clouds. A real pleasure to spend some time with the children and so lovely to be let out of the office for a little while. Can't wait for next week! 




