Following new guidance to schools, we now have a nominated Paediatric first aid member of staff. During training it was raised that children under the age of 5 should avoid having popcorn, marshmallows or uncut grapes, all of which have

appeared in some children's lunch boxes. As a precautionary measure we would request that these items are not included in your child's lunchbox. A polite reminder too, that we are a 'Nut Free' school. Thank you.

School Meals and Healthy Lunch Boxes



Under the UIFSM Government scheme, children in Yr R, 1 and 2 are entitled to a hot meal at school each day. It is your responsibility to order the meals that you would like for your child through the Parent Pay/Cypad portal.

The ordered meals are provided for your child and school is charged for this per meal ordered.

We seem to have a number of children who have ordered meals but are then bringing a packed lunch from home.

We have a report which shows us meals ordered and not taken, for our monitoring purposes.

Please could we ask that you do not order a meal if your child is having a packed lunch as we are charged for this and it is then wasted food.

If you have ordered a meal and then change your mind, please remember to cancel this if possible.

The cost to school for wasted meals in September was £105.60 Your support to help us to keep our costs down and reduce our food wastage is greatly appreciated.

Some Deep Learning about the Deep Sea!

It was wonderful to welcome Dr Roterman from the University of Portsmouth Marine Biology department into school again this week. On his last visit he amazed Apple Class with tales of his deep sea exploration; this time it was Chestnut Class' turn to use his expertise to enrich their class topic 'Dragons, Darwin and DNA'.

Doctor Roterman talked about what his job was like and how it worked. He told the children about a tradition where they had thrown fresh buckets of sea water at him to celebrate his first time going down in a submarine. Everyone was intrigued about the model of a Japanese submarine which could open up and was a replica of the real life one he had gone down to the deep ocean in.

What brought the amazed faces to the children was when he actually took out showed us real life specimens of Hoff crabs, preserved in pots of alcohol. Dr Roterman was part of a team of marine biologists who discovered this species. The crab apparently got its comical nickname from because it has a hairy chest! He discovered it at the bottom of the ocean eating bacteria.

It was amazing to work with Dr Roterman and so interesting to hear about the work of a marine biologist. Khloe Stamp.
