The children were astonished by some of the stories they heard, of a V2 bomb landing close to West Dean, of a fighter plane crash just up the hill from the school, as well as memories of hurrying to the Anderson Shelter and putting wellies on the wrong feet in the rush! The children are using some of the memories they heard to inform their own creative writing. This work will be on display at the village VE commemoration flower festival in West Dean Church over the May Bank Holiday weekend 3rd to 5th May.







Maple Class Forest School - Maples had fun on our beautiful pond this week with 100% success rate in floating rafts and boats they had each made with natural resources from the orchard. Each of their chicks were able to have a sail and Maples spotted a newt and a tadpole too!

They said your mystery object is a clamp, and it would have attached something to a pole. This could have been on a railway signal pole as shown in the old black and white picture of Petersfield Station I have attached. The railway signals are the structures shown in the middle of the photo; they told the train driver if they could move or not using the semaphore system.

I have also attached a modern photo of Castleton East where you might just be able to see similar clamps to yours attaching equipment to the black and white signal pole.




EASTER SERVICE IN CHURCH

Due to Easter being just about as late in the year as it can be this year, it was a little early to be holding an Easter service in church before we broke up for the holidays this week. Rev Sarah did visit us to lead worship with us in school on Friday morning, but we are going to hold our main Easter Service in St Andrew's Church, West Dean on the Friday at the end of the week that we return to school, which will be **Friday 25th April at 8.45am**.

We ask parents and carers to bring children directly to the church for the service by 8.35am, ready for an 8.45 start, rather than coming to school first.

Staff will be on hand to welcome the children between 8.25 and 8.35 and we ask that you access Church Lane from the A285, operating a **one-way system**, dropping off at the Church and exiting through the village.

Parents, carers and relatives are welcome to join us for the service, which will last for approximately half an hour. If you intend to do so, please drop your child off first, as described above, before finding parking elsewhere in the village.


Lifesaving at Westgate
