Woodland Wellbeing All of the children and staff enjoyed our first fabulous Wellbeing Walk of the year at West Dean College on Wednesday morning. The younger children explored the beautiful gardens next to the main house, whilst the older children took on the challenge of the full circle route through the arboretum and over the hill.

Beech and Chestnut children stopped for a 'Forest Church' period of reflection, during which they listened to a reading of 'The Way through the Woods' by Rudyard Kipling and the rather beautiful 'Prayer of The Woods', which apparently adorns entrances to many of the National Parks in the USA. It was a wonderful, healthy morning of appreciating nature around us.

Dear Parent/Carers

With the half term holiday rapidly approaching, no doubt some families will be making plans to travel or spend some family time on day trips during the week long break. I write today with news of some very exciting school related travel that I will be embarking on myself during the half term break. I have been invited to visit Xilitla, in Mexico, the town with which West Dean has a link through the story and life of Edward James.

Many of you will know that our school has a long association with West Dean College and Estate, as well as with the visionary Edward James, who, in 1964, gifted his estate to a charitable trust, laying the foundation for the establishment of West Dean College as a place to develop and protect arts and crafts learning.

The part that you may not know, is that Edward himself moved to the Americas in the 1940s, settling in the subtropical rainforest of Mexico, in the small town of Xilitla (pronounced Hee-leet-la), where he lived, on and off, for the last forty years of his life until he passed away in 1984. There, in the rainforest of Xilitla, Edward James built a surrealist sculpture garden, now recognised as a World Heritage Site.

Edward James was laid to rest in West Dean Arboretum and our children regularly pass his simple, but beautiful gravestone whilst on our Wellbeing Walks through the woods. From 1944 on, Edward James spent much of his time helping to nurture a spirit of creativity in Xilitla and Mexico. Thanks to this spirit, and Edward James' extraordinary story, we have a completely unique link with Xilitla in Mexico, which over many years, our school has tried to develop in a number of ways. One of our initiatives won the 'Guardian' Classroom Innovation Awards. The prize was shared with the school in Xilitla to which we donated two laptops and other equipment which enabled the children to have a more global access to the world.

Part of our school improvement plan is focussed on developing further links with our community; on a local, UK wide and international level, enabling the children to deepen their understanding of their place in the world, as well as the views, culture and life experience of those who live in very contrasting locations to West Dean. Consequently, we have an ongoing project to rejuvenate our link and relationship with schools in Xilitla so that there can be a continued exchange between teachers and children in Xilitla and West Dean.

Supported by charity fundraising organised some years ago by one of our school governors, Dr Sharon-Michi Kusunoki, as well as a generous donation from a supporter who has a long association with West Dean and Xilitla, I have been invited to travel to Mexico this October. The aim of the trip is to meet with members of the school community in Xilitla, and to discuss and plan how we can work in partnership to enrich the learning of the children in our schools through collaborative projects.

I feel it is really important to reassure you that school funds are not being used for this trip. We are excited by this project, but it is not a priority to which we would direct school funding. Some years ago, through some incredible fundraising work with the Embassy of Mexico in the UK, funds were donated expressly to support this cultural exchange. It is our hope that we will be able to welcome some teachers from Xilitla to West Dean in the future, as well as facilitate further travel for others from West Dean.

This is an unusual and exciting opportunity, in which I feel truly privileged to be involved. To facilitate the lengthy travel, our School Governors have approved that I will be away from school for four days prior to the start of half term and the rest of the trip will be within the half term break. Careful plans will be in place to ensure the smooth and safe running of West Dean School in my absence.

I plan to send photos and video back to the children in school, before they break up for half term, to raise their interest and excitement in the project, as well as share progress on the trip, potentially using Google Classroom – more details to follow on this. Longer term, our vision is for the children themselves to communicate and learn with the children in Xilitla, again embracing the tools we now have to collaborate online.

Very exciting times indeed!



We are once again pleased to be holding our School Harvest Festival Service in St Andrew's Church this year. We ask parents and carers to bring children directly to the church for the service on **Friday 6th October by 8.35am** ready for an 8.45 start, rather than coming to school first.

Supporting your child's online activity

In the fast moving world of the internet and social media, we all know that it can be very challenging to balance the need to monitor a child's online activity and ensure they are safe, whilst also giving them the freedom to discover all of the positive aspects of being online.

Later this year, we plan to run an information evening for parents, hopefully with an expert speaker, where advice will be shared in achieving this balance.

In school, we have filtering and monitoring procedures in place, which ensure that the children do not encounter any negative or harmful influence whilst online in the course of their classroom learning.

However, there are occasional instances of children feeling upset in school, due to language or behaviour that they have experienced online, outside of school. It is very much part of our duty of care to the children to support in protecting them from this as well, even though in the physical sense we cannot monitor what the children do online outside of school.

Governor News

There have been some changes to our governing body for the start of this new school year.

After many years of dedicated service as our Chair of Governors, Mrs Wendy Goacher has stepped down from this role. We thank Wendy sincerely for the love, care and tremendous support that she has given to our school. Fortunately, Wendy is staying on the governing body as a Foundation Governor appointed by the Diocese of Chichester, so we say THANK YOU, but not goodbye!

We are delighted that Mr Edward Younghusband has been elected by the governors as our new Chair. As well as being a parent of two children at the school, Edward brings a wide skill set and wealth of business experience. We look forward to working with him as Chair of Governors.

Also joining the governors is Mrs Christine Standing, a member of our local church congregation and resident of West Dean, who has been appointed as a Foundation Governor by the Diocese of Chichester.

In addition, Mr Ian Graham, who is Director of Estates for West Dean Estate, and now an Apple Class parent, has been appointed as a co-opted governor. Welcome to the team Christine and Ian.

Finally, following the recent election, we are very pleased to welcome Mr Henry Forbes as our new Parent Governor. We look forward to working with you, Henry.

We now have a full compliment of 12 governors, which puts us in a strong, supported position to move forward this year.

Tax-Free Childcare (TFC) is a childcare top-up for working parents. It can be used to help pay for accredited holiday clubs, childminders, or sports activities. This enables parents and carers to access childcare during the school holidays, also saving them money. It is estimated that there are 1.3 million working families who are eligible for TFC in the UK however only a small percentage are making use of the scheme. Around 75% of families are losing out on this support.

TFC is available for children aged up to 11, or 17 if the child has a disability. We can signpost families to Childcare Choices so they can see if they are eligible. Find out more about the scheme by visiting <u>www.gov.uk/tax-free-childcare</u>.

Many parents don't realise that TFC can be saved up on their accounts. Even if childcare is not required throughout the school terms, there is still the option to save up funds which could be used for holiday clubs or out of school care. As the new term commences, it is a good opportunity for us to remind families of these schemes so they can plan for the upcoming half terms and holidays.

Foodbank Friday 29th September


Thank you for supporting our 'Food Bank Friday', we had an amazing array of donations. This is an opportunity for us all to support Chichester Food Bank, a project founded by local churches and community groups, working together towards stopping hunger in our local area.

Non-perishable, in-date food is donated to a foodbank. Volunteers sort food and pack it into boxes ready to be given to people in need. Over 40,000 people give up their time to volunteer at foodbanks. Foodbanks partner with a wide range of care professionals such as doctors, health visitors, social workers and police to identify people in crisis and issue them with a foodbank voucher. Foodbank clients bring their voucher to a foodbank centre where it can be redeemed for three days' emergency food. Volunteers meet clients over a warm drink or free hot meal and are able to signpost people to agencies able to solve the longer-term problem.

Your help is greatly appreciated. If you weren't able to make a donation today, we will also be collecting items to donate to the Foodbank at our Harvest Service next week.
