Dear Parents and Carers,

We rounded off a successful first term of the school year yesterday with a wonderful walk in the gardens at West Dean College. After days of lovely autumn sunshine, the awful early morning weather made it look unlikely that we would all be able to get out, but I have to say, I was given a lesson in resilience and positivity by our very youngest children and their teachers. Apple Class were the first to be ready, all in full waterproof gear with beaming smiles and full of encouragement saying "Come on Mr Williams, let's do it!"

...and they were right to be positive. Off we all went, enduring no more than 20 minutes of rain before the clouds parted and the warm sunshine returned, so much so that all the waterproofs were being peeled off within minutes as we all started to overheat. Not knowing quite what the weather would do next, we modified our plans slightly, with just Chestnut Class venturing up towards the arboretum and the three other classes remaining on lower ground, exploring the beauty and variety within the gardens around the main house. Despite adapted plans, all of the children were no less excited and all enjoyed a fantastic morning of discovery. I reminded the children during our Friday collective worship this morning of just how lucky we are to have access to such beautiful gardens on our doorstep and such a supportive relationship with West Dean College. As the children get used to increasingly frequent trips to the estate, it would be easy to start to take it for granted, but we must remember what a special privilege it is, even in the pouring rain!

Well, that is one sixth of our school year ticked off already, but as we look back on the past seven weeks, which have sped by in the blink of an eye, so much great learning has happened and a lot has been achieved. There has been a real learning 'buzz' around school, with the children enjoying a wonderful cross curricular approach to learning, from the Apple children's amazing shop and fundraising, Maple Class space exploration, Beech Class channelling their inner stone age selves during Forest School, to some incredible and very poignant writing from the perspective of someone who experienced *The Blitz* in Chestnut Class.

After next week's holiday, the second half term will begin with one of the more sombre occasions of the year, as we mark Remembrance Day on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> November. However, by way of balance and enabling the children to appreciate the positive community spirit that flourished during wartime, following our act of remembrance on the morning of the 11<sup>th</sup>, in the afternoon, the 'evacuees' of Chestnut Class will be hosting a special wartime *Revival Community Café*, so look out for details of this, accompanying this newsletter.

Many of you will know that October is Black History Month, a period marked in a variety of ways in different parts of the world, all with the ultimate aim of (and I quote this from the BHM website) 'encouraging African and Caribbean heritage peoples, to learn together about their shared history and to share this with each other and the wider population'.

At various points this year, several parents have asked me if and how we approach this subject with the children at school. This aspect of education is vitally important if we are to enable our children to grow into respectful, tolerant and inclusive global citizens. It is also an example of actively living the passage from John 13 that we hold in such importance as a school 'to love one another, as I have loved you'. This October we opted not to apply a Black History Month theme to our assemblies and collective worship, but instead have looked at the themes of **courage** and **inclusivity**, and have positive discussions about the courageous action of people from past and present, including Martin Luther King, Rosa Parks and Barack Obama. We feel it is important that your children hear these positive messages, which reflect diversity in our world all the time, not just during this month. Consequently, whilst BHM is most certainly something that we have incorporated into the plan for Collective Worship and Assemblies in October, more importantly, we are constantly developing ways to include increasingly diverse examples and stories within the wider curriculum throughout the year. Do come and talk to me if you have any questions about this – I always like to hear your feedback and ideas. Ask your children about it too, they have listened really carefully during assemblies and have had a lot of interesting things to say on the subject.

I thank all of the teachers and staff for the thought and care they put into making learning fun and engaging every single day and congratulate the children on their consistent enthusiasm and thirst for learning this half term. I hope that all of you, our school families and staff, have a relaxing and refreshing half term holiday week and return with renewed energy for the second half of the autumn term.

# Join us at West Dean on Friday 4th November for a fantastic free firework display!


