Parent Consultation Evenings

Thank you to everyone who attended our parent consultation evenings this week. This is a really important part of how you can support your child in their learning. If you were unable to attend on this occasion, please do get in touch with your child's teacher after the half term break, to arrange a time for a conversation.

We will have our own altar in school after half term, and, if you find yourself in London next week, the Ambassador told us there will be a pretty magnificent altar in the Embassy of Mexico in Belgravia!

If you have ordered a meal and then change your mind, please remember to cancel this if possible. The cost to school for wasted meals in September was £105.60 Your support to help us to keep our costs down and reduce our food wastage is greatly appreciated. Last week the cost to school was £12.80
