Dear Parents and Carers,

It seems only yesterday that I was wishing you all a happy and peaceful Christmas, and here we are at the end of the spring term, preparing for the Easter weekend.

Much as the time has flown by, such a lot has happened this term. During worship this morning, I was looking back at our Instagram feed, which gives just a snapshot of the brilliant learning and events that have taken place; creative activities, trips out, visitors into school, sporting events, Chestnut Class at the O2 to name just a few things. As always, we are immensely grateful for the hard work and dedication of our brilliant staff team for making this all happen, and to you, our school families for your support.

During worship this week, we have been thinking about the events of Holy Week, following what Rev Sarah called a 'Whistlestop description' of this when we were in church last Friday. Many people will be familiar with Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday (today), Good Friday and of course Easter Day, but less is known or considered about Holy Monday and Holy Tuesday. This is when the Bible tells us of Jesus' anger at those who were dealing in money in the temple, but it is another story about the temple, that of 'The Widow's Offering' that we discussed in a bit more detail, and for good reason.

This story in Mark 12 describes how Jesus and his disciples watch a series of increasingly wealthy people place an offering of money through a hole in the temple wall, as was the custom. Last of all, a widow with very little money placed just two coins as her offering. Jesus explained to his disciples that although her offering was small in monetary value, it was all she had and therefore proportionally huge, compared to the offering of the wealthy.

The reason I told this story was that a few days ago something incredible and remarkably similar happened in school. Inspired by an assembly about Chestnut Tree House Children's Hospice, without being asked, one of our Year Four children brought in the contents of her piggy bank—just over £4 of her own money and donated it to Chestnut Tree House. Not a huge amount of money, but the world to that kind girl, and she gave it happily and freely. I find it really heartening when our children are actively living out the Christian values of our school in their everyday actions.

When I told this story and made this comparison to the children during worship, I did stress to them that I was not asking them to all go home and empty their money boxes! It was more to draw attention to how one child thought about the need in the world and decided that she could make a small but important difference herself, which I think is wonderful.


### Amazing Algebra with Mr P!
