### Shrove Tuesday & Ash Wednesday

It surely cannot have escaped your notice that it was Shrove Tuesday (aka Pancake Day) this week and no doubt many of you slaved over a hot frying pan all evening at family tea time!

In school, lots of the children got the chance to make and taste pancakes and in collective worship, we looked at the meaning of 'Shrove' or 'Shriving' and tried to beat what we thought to be a truly amazing world record for pancake tossing of 424 in 2 minutes. We've now fact checked this and the current record is actually 140 flips in 60 seconds. In school our fantastic flippers managed just over 60 flips in 2 minutes.



In Beech Class, the children also looked at Shrove Tuesday celebration in other parts of the world and made some fantastic Mardi Gras masks.

Ash Wednesday worship actually took place this morning, as Rev. Sarah was able to join us for our Friday Acorn Assembly and lead us in an invitational signing of the cross in ash on the foreheads of those who wished to receive it. For those of you who are not familiar with this tradition and practice in the Christian Church, the palm crosses from the previous year are burnt and the



ash is used by the priest to make a sign of the cross on a person's forehead, as a symbol of repentance and forgiveness at the beginning of the season of Lent. As with all aspects of worship in school, we hold special value in this, but always ensure that participation is completely invitational. A significant number of children and adults chose to come to receive the sign of the cross from Rev. Sarah during a period of reflection and quiet, calming music.
