Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back, I hope that you enjoyed some quality family time during the half term break. Thank you for your patience during the unsettled weather this week. It is always challenging to predict what the weather is going to do and make the right call in ensuring everyone's safety, but thankfully the impact of the storm in the Chichester area was not too serious and we were able to remain open and keep learning!

I hope that you will have already seen the report from our recent church (SIAMS) inspection, which was sent to you yesterday. If you missed it, a copy is now available on our school website: https://www.westdean.w-sussex.sch.uk/web/church_siams_inspection_report/252851

We are delighted with the outcome of the inspection, which celebrates all that we are as a loving, child-focussed Christian community and acknowledges all that we do to actively live the words of our Christian vision from John 13, 'to love one another. As I have loved you...' I am very proud of our community and of the recognition of the good work it does in this report, and I cannot thank you all enough for the incredible support you all give to this school family.

As you know, I recently had the incredible privilege of travelling to Mexico, to visit Xilitla and meet with members of the local community, including the leadership team of the local primary school, Escuela María Concepción Villegas or Escuela MACOVI for short.

It was a remarkable trip that I will never forget. Mexico is such a vibrant and colourful country and everyone I met was so welcoming and keen to teach me about their culture. Las Pozas, the garden built by Edward James, is simply extraordinary; a truly unique, spiritual space where Edward's surreal artistic vision sits within the majestic, luscious jungle, just on the edge of Xilitla town. Having only previously known half of the Edward James story, the part of his life spent in West Dean, it was fantastic to experience this magical place where he spent the second half of his life. Hopefully you will have seen some of the pictures from my trip on Google Classroom. If you haven't, do ask your child to login and show you.

So, a lovely trip for me is all very well, but what does all of this mean for the children? Well, I spent a considerable time with the teachers in MACOVI school, discussing and planning how we can develop our unique link further and get our children communicating and learning from each other. Charitable funding is in place to support further teacher exchange, so hopefully, in the not too distant future, we will be welcoming teachers from Xilitla to spend some time with us in West Dean, and in time someone else from West Dean to Xilitla.

We had hoped to get MACOVI school using a special Google Classroom that we have set up, and to an extent they will be able to, but unfortunately IT and technology is not so developed in schools in Mexico, so initially at least, we will be relying on the teachers to upload the children's work and ideas to the shared classroom, rather than the children in Xilitla doing this themselves. It just goes to show how fortunate we are to have such extensive digital resources here in UK schools. It will be possible for our children to work collaboratively with the children in Xilitla in some form though, and the teachers at MACOVI are certainly excited to get started.

My trip to Mexico coincided with the 'Dia de Muertos' or Day of the Dead festival, which is a very important and much celebrated time for families. Commonly misunderstood in the UK as being related to Halloween, the Dia de Muertos is in fact a very joyful festival where the lives of departed family members are celebrated and fond memories shared. Despite the appearance of skulls and skeletons everywhere, this festival is actually extremely colourful and not at all spooky. Brightly coloured and highly decorated altars are common place in homes and public buildings, in honour of family members past, often including a cross in thanks to God for their lives.

So keen were the people I met to share their culture with the children in West Dean, that they packed me off home with everything I needed to create a Dia de Muertos altar here in school. So I did just that this week and placed a picture of Edward James at the top. Each class has

been to look at the altar with me and the children have had the opportunity to discuss ideas and ask questions. It won't surprise you to hear that their questions were excellent and their ideas profound.

Whilst I feel personally privileged to have been on this amazing trip, I also think that we are tremendously fortunate as a community to have such a unique link with this incredible place, culture and people in Mexico.

Next week, we will turn our thoughts to remembrance of a different kind, as we prepare for Armistice Day with a special Act of Remembrance during our Acorn Assembly next Friday.

Pupil Parliament will be selling poppies and other symbols of remembrance throughout next week, so do send your child in with some spare change if you would like them to make a donation and wear a poppy.

I wish you a peaceful weekend, hopefully with slightly more settled weather.




Chestnut Class Pre-Loved Toy Sale.

Friday 3rd November.


