
It was fantastic to see everyone rise to this challenge, putting in a brilliant run up to the top, around the remains of the iron-age fort and back down to the car park.

The children were also commended for how well they engaged as an audience, showing real support for their peers and genuine interest in all they had to say. As teachers, a privilege of the job is that we get to




experience many of these proud 'achievement moments', but we have to say, this was up there with the best of them!

hosting **activities for the whole family to enjoy** from **11am** – so why not make a day of it and explore what Petworth House and the town have to offer before the shows begin!


On Friday 21 February and Saturday 22 February laser lights return to the Canal Basin in Chichester with shows at 6pm and 7.30pm!



Choristers spend about 18 hours each week rehearsing and singing services, as well studying two instruments and following a full school curriculum of academic work, sport and drama.
