The Lion King - Information

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are delighted to invite you to the West Dean CE Primary School summer production of The Lion King Junior, which will take place on the evening of Monday 14th July, starting at 6.00pm.

The children are all busy making masks; channelling their inner African animals; rehearsing their lines, songs and dances, as well as preparing scenery and gathering costumes. There is a real buzz of excitement and I have no doubt that we are in for a real treat of a performance.

COSTUMES - We would like all children (excluding lionesses) to wear black as their base layer (masks etc will then be added during the performance).

We would like all children to provide a short sleeved black t-shirt and black leggings/skins, these must be plain with NO logos/pictures on. These were meant to be in school by today, 4th July, but if that has not been possible, we would be grateful if these items could be sent into school as soon as possible early next week.

We are enormously grateful for the support and hospitality of West Dean College, as the performance will take place in a grand marquee on one of their beautiful lawns. What a truly magical location that should be on a summer's evening!

Tickets are priced at £7 per person. Originally, four tickets for every family were guaranteed. As the deadline for claiming these has now passed, the remaining tickets are on general sale to the school community on a first come first served basis, purchasable on SchoolMoney

Ideally, we would respectfully request that very young siblings are not brought to the performance on this occasion, as we want to give your children the best chance of being heard and giving their best performance. However, do come and talk to us if this is going to be a problem for you. We aim to invite the children and staff from the Pre-School to see the dress rehearsal on Monday afternoon – details of this are to be confirmed with the Pre-School.

A bar will be open for you to purchase pre-show drinks. Then **after** the show (weather dependent) we invite you to bring a picnic for you to share with your family. The bar will reopen after the show and will close at 8.30pm.

It is important that you familiarise yourself with the timings for the day (on the following page), as the whole day, including school timings and location, will be different to normal. Activ8 care will be available, but please bear in mind the children will be need to be back for the performance by 5.15 / 5.30 – details of how this will look on that day will be communicated in due course.

Timings for the day of Monday 14th July

As we only have use of the marquee for one day, we will spend the entire school day on 14th July at West Dean College. NO children will come to West Dean School that day.

8:30am Children to be dropped off at West Dean College car park in school uniform

Children will need packed lunch, snack and refillable water bottle – please CANCEL / DO NOT BOOK Chartwells meals

2:45pm Apple and Maple Class children to be picked up from West Dean College (there will be no clubs or swimming on this day)

3:00pm Beech and Chestnut Class children to be picked up from West Dean College

Activ8 after school care can be booked for this day. Activ8 staff will be collecting children and walking them through West Dean Gardens, back to school. Any children booked into Activ8 should be collected from school at your agreed pick-up time.

Timings on the evening

5.15pm Arrival at West Dean College for children in Chestnut and Beech – children to arrive in black costumes

5.30pm Arrival at West Dean College for children in Apple and Maple - children to arrive in black costumes

(If you have children in both, please come at the earlier time).

5.15pm Bar opens for pre-performance drinks.

5.50pm Bar closes for performance and the marquee will be opened. Please note, you will not be allowed access to the marquee before this time and no reservation of seats is permitted.

6.00pm Performance begins

7.15pm (approx.) Performance ends. The bar will re-open as soon as possible after this time. Families are welcome to stay and enjoy their own picnic in the beautiful surroundings of West Dean Gardens.

All drinks available from the bar (both soft and alcoholic) will be served in a can. If you would prefer to enjoy your drink in a cup or glass, please bring your own with you picnic.

8.30pm Bar closes – thank you and goodnight!

We hope that you will be able to join us to watch our performance, celebrate the children's summer term learning and enjoy a lovely social gathering as we near the end of the school year. This will be the culmination of a huge project for our school, so it would be lovely to have as many of you as possible with us to share in the magic!

Do please take note of the key dates and times listed above, so that you are well prepared to support us in the smooth running of the show.

Keeping families safe over the summer holidays By Katie Bates, Advanced Public Health Practitioner

Sun safety

UV rays are strongest when the sun is highest in the sky, which in the UK summer is between 11:00 and 15:00. The strength of UV rays will vary depending on the country, so be aware of this if you are going abroad this summer. Find out more about what to do in a heat wave on the <u>NHS website</u>.

Anyone can get sunburnt, including people with darker skin. Generally, people with lighter skin tones are at higher risk of sunburn, but just because people with darker skin tones might have a lower risk, this doesn't mean there is no risk at all. Therefore, everyone needs to follow sun safety messages. Find out more about sun safety on the <u>NHS website</u>. You can still get sunburnt on cloudy days. Skin-damaging UV rays can pass through clouds so check the UV index even if it's cloudy outside.

Whilst most of us welcome warmer weather, the sun and heat can pose a significant health risk, especially to vulnerable people including children. To help you and your family stay safe this summer please follow our top tips:

- Spend time in the shade, especially between 11:00 and 15:00 in the UK
- · Cover up with clothes, a wide brimmed hat and UV protection sunglasses
- Apply sunscreen with at least SPF 30 to protect against UVB and at least four or five stars UVA protection - use it generously, reapply regularly and use together with shade and clothing
- Keep hydrated by drinking plenty of water, especially when playing outside
- Keep your home cool by closing blinds and curtains on windows exposed to direct sunlight; move to the coolest part of your home; open windows (if safe to do so) when the air feels cooler outside than in
- If you or a family member does become sunburnt, please follow the <u>NHS guidance</u>



Seek shade Take a break under trees or umbrolias, especially in the middle of the day when the sun is strongest.

How to enjoy the sun safely



Cover up Wear a tap that covers your shoulders, a wide-brimmed hat and UV-protection subglosses Apply sunscreen Fick one with at least SPF 30 and 5 of 5 dam. Use it generausly and regularly.

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
