

Ash Wednesday and Lent

As next week sees the beginning of the season of Lent, with Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday, Rev Sarah will be joining us for worship in school next Friday for a special 'Ash Friday'.

During this worship, the children will have the option of receiving the sign of the cross from Rev Sarah, marked in ash on their forehead. Traditionally, the ash comes from the burning of the previous year's palm crosses.



If you are unfamiliar with this practice, I offer you this article and explanation, passed onto us by Austen Hindman, Head Teacher at Bishop Luffa School (FYI—the date refers to Ash Wednesday last year):


On returning from Singleton with beaming smiles, the children said, "we loved meeting children from the other schools and playing some funny and exciting drama games!"





An important letter from our PTA—PLEASE READ

Dear West Dean Parents and Carers,

We expect that some of you reading this will see the mention of 'PTA' and stop reading. Please don't. There is crucial information in this message.

The Annual General Meeting of the West Dean Parent Teacher Association (PTA) will be held on Monday 17th March 2025 immediately after school at 3:00pm. All are welcome and encouraged to attend. As many of us will have children in tow, we expect this to be a brief, but important meeting as the PTA is at critical junction.

While all of you are already part of the PTA by virtue of having a child at school, the constitution of the charity requires that a core committee of members oversee the operations. The current group of committee members and charity trustees are stepping down from their roles. Many have been involved for a number of years (one no longer has a child at the school). This has opened up the opportunity for a new generation of parents/carers to step in and take the reins (we already have one volunteer willing to take on the treasurer duties). This would also be an opportune time to look at restructuring, with a proposal to have 'class representatives' take on more manageable one-year terms, having been suggested.

The PTA is a really important link with the school. Not only does the group help to support school events, the funds raised go directly to *supporting our children* and allowing them to take part in special and enriching activities they might not normally get to do.

For those of you who do not know what goes on behind the scenes, the PTA have traditionally supported the school with a whole host of activities and events. *Please see the list of examples attached to this letter.

As most previous PTA members can attest, primary school is over before we know it. For this reason, the PTA changes year on year as people leave and new parents join the school. Everyone is a volunteer so it is appreciated that at any moment, time to dedicate to the PTA can change.

Because we are at this <u>critical point</u>, we need any parents and carers, especially those in Apple or Maple classes, who may be interested in getting involved to come forward and have a chat about how you can help. We know that many are happy to help with ad hoc duties as they arise, and we are grateful for that help, however the future of West Dean PTA is relying on you to take the plunge! <u>There is a real possibility that if volunteers are not found now for key roles, the charity will need to be closed with the remaining funds allocated when the trustees step down.</u>

Overleaf, is a (non-exhaustive) list of things that the PTA support, host or fund.

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- <u>Tea & Tissues</u> for new parents to meet and mingle while their reception aged children set off on their first day in Apple Class.
- **Bookfest** supporting children's reading through the Chichester Bookfest and author visits to the school.
- <u>Music Lessons</u> the PTA is very proud to be able to support music lessons in school through the 1 term 2 learn programme. Children in years 3-6 all take part in instrumental music lessons each autumn term.
- <u>Uniform Sales</u> held termly, the sale of good condition used branded uniform give parents an affordable alternative to purchasing new school uniform.
- <u>Film Nights</u> normally held a couple of times per year, children can enjoy a movie complete with popcorn, drinks and snacks. Bringing pillows and onesies to school is always fun!
- <u>Wreath Making</u> this pre-Christmas event has been hosted for a number of years and brings parents together for an evening of crafting fun, complete with mulled wine and mince pies.
- <u>Father Christmas</u> the PTA work as honorary 'elves' and buy and wrap the gifts that are distributed by Father Christmas each December during the annual visit to West Dean College.
- <u>Christmas Lunch</u> the PTA decorate the hall and serve up a special Christmas dinner to the pupils, teachers and governors. There are crackers and games too.
- **Evening of Song** held in December 2024, brought together families for an evening filled with music, warming drinks and treats.
- <u>Discos</u> the school and PTA aim to host 1-2 disco events each school year (Christmas and end of year). A professional DJ supplied the tunes, smoke, snow and giveaways with some teacher dance moves also on display.
- **Swimming Transport** the PTA contribute annually to the cost to transport KS2 children for swimming lessons.
- <u>School Pool</u> the West Dean swimming pool is a unique feature of the school and is used by all children. The PTA pay towards the running costs each year.
- <u>Easter</u> the PTA have in the past hosted Easter hunts, races and games with chocolate eggs also supplied for all pupils.
- <u>Fiestas, Fetes and Sizzlers</u> numerous different social fundraisers are held throughout the year. These events are important to bring families together, and to raise funds for the charity.
- <u>Plant Sales</u> the plant sales are usually a bit hit with parents/carers as well as our local neighbours. With generous donations of plants via a local grower, this has traditionally been a popular and profitable part of the PTA fundraising.
- <u>After-School Swimming</u> the PTA support the organisation of volunteers to oversee after-school swimming during the summer term.
- <u>School Productions</u> the PTA have supported the school during the wonderful summer productions they put
- <u>Year 6 Leavers Tea</u> the families of each child who leaves the school are invited to the Year 6 Leavers Tea. It is a special event to say goodbye to their primary school days.
- <u>Sport Day</u> the PTA supply frozen treats to cool down the competitors after the events. Raffles and drink sales for observers are also held.
- <u>Treetop Library Renovation</u> the PTA donated the funds and time to transform the upstairs library into a Treetop masterpiece. Children are able to enjoy all the pleasure of reading in the unique and amazing space.
- <u>Laptops and iPads</u> the PTA have donated significant funds to school to help buy new IT equipment that is essential for children's learning.
- <u>Social Events for Parents/Carers</u> many fun and social events have been hosted by the PTA over the years, including quiz nights, casino nights, art auctions and special dinner events. No children allowed for these ones!
